
Push and shove, push and shove, try to stay alive. The place is filled from wall to wall, I think I'm going to hide.

A. Well, it might be nice if some of the Mini-school girls stayed up to meet me with milk and cookies and other refreshments when I come down the chimney.


Q. Do you ever have problems with people leaving their fires burning when you come down the chimney?
